cut from your fabric. She will do a workshop in the spring.**

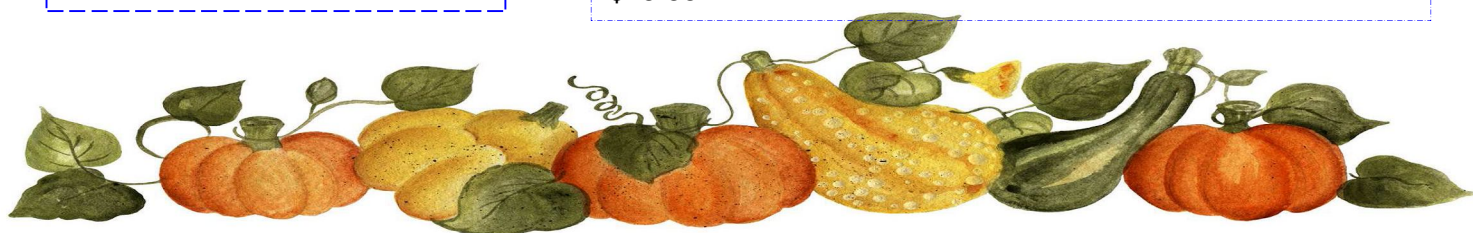

SEPTEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Agnes Gates

Mystery in 2 months.

Here is a very nice quick project to give as a gift or keep for yourself. Measures 22" x 26" approx.

Choose a theme, season, or holiday. The fabrics (palette) you use will be determined by your theme. For instance, I will be doing mine for Christmas so I will pick out about 6 different shades of reds, and greens, then a couple each of golds, blues, yellows, etc. You do not need yardage, scraps will do for these.

Supply list:

Foundation Fabric: 1 yard or a piece of fabric cut to 22" X 26". Press out wrinkles and set aside.

The foundation fabric will be your back ground. A solid color fabric, a subdued print, or any fabric that enhances the design would work well for the foundation.

Palette fabrics: About 1/16 of a yard each of 2 main fabrics, for me that would be the green and red.

Scraps for the golds, blues, yellows, etc. You may use as many fabrics as you wish, keeping in mind your theme.

Fusible Web: about 2 yards.

Getting ready: Pre-Fuse Palette Fabrics:

Iron the palette fabrics with a hot steam iron to remove wrinkles and to preshrink. Pre-fuse the web to the back of the palette fabrics, following the instruction included with the web.

In the next newsletter, will be the finishing instructions.

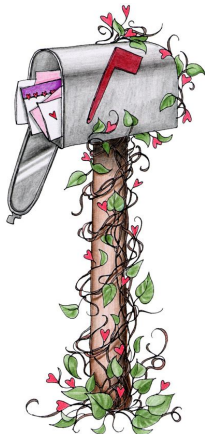

Pineapple Fluff JoAnn Tighe

2 pkg low fat cream cheese (8 oz.)
1 can of crushed pineapple (20), drained
1 container of lite Cool Whip (8 oz.)
1½ - 2 cups pretzels, crushed
1 cup melted butter
½ cup sugar or Splenda

Mix pretzels, sugar and butter together. Bake for 10 min. at 350° Let cool.

Mix cream cheese and pineapple together, add Cool Whip. Add pretzel mixture just before serving. P.S. You can add a little bit of sugar to the pineapple mixture if it seems to tart.
