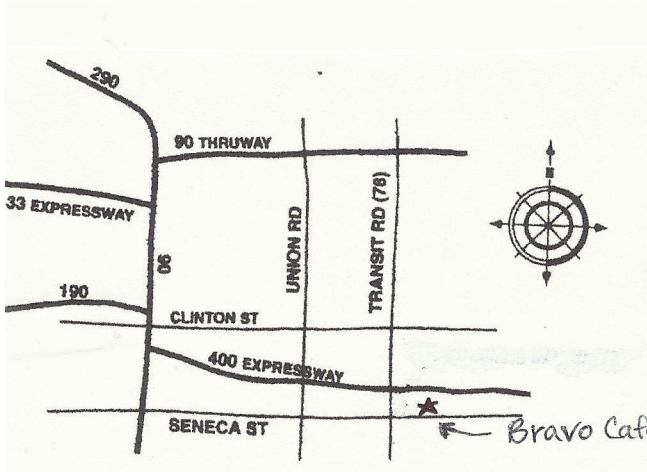

HOSTESS DUTIES

As A quilt guild member everyone takes a turn at being a hostess at a monthly meeting. The hostess list is circulated annually for members to make changes and to include new members. This information is also announced at the general meetings. Each member's assigned month is published in the Newsletter, two months at a time, to enable a member to make a change if necessary. If a member is unable to participate in her assigned month, it is her responsibility to find a substitute.

What do I do?

You prepare a refreshment. Whatever you like, whether it be a sweet or savory. Try to make it bite size and easy to serve and carry (unless it is really, really good, then just bring it!). There should be 10 hostesses each month, and meetings are generally well attended, keep that in mind with portions. Also consider "healthy" and sugar free snacks. The club provides regular coffee, tea bags, powder creamer, sugar packets and maybe a seasonal drink mix, as well as paper products. The church includes the decaf coffee packets in our rent. If you want to bring a different beverage, let the other hostesses that month know.

On meeting day, plan on arriving early, 9 - 9:15 a.m.

But its fall (or spring, or some other holiday) and I would like to do something festive, with a theme. What can I do?

Great! Feel free to contact the other hostesses assigned that month with your theme and coordinate a menu, decorations (tablecloth, centerpiece, flowers, coordinated plates, cups and napkins, etc.) with them. The minimum hostess requirement is food, ambiance is a treat!

So its 9 a.m. on a meeting day ,and I'm in the kitchen (and its scary, 'cause there's no sewing machine in there!), now what?

Relax, its just a kitchen. Retrieve the hostess items from storage. Morningstar's storage is through the French doors, next to the elevator on the left, in a closet under the stairs (now *this is* really scary!). Bring out the large coffee pot (in a box), a white plastic laundry basket that has paper products and a small clear plastic tote (blue top) that has coffee and other essentials. These should be identified as Morningstar's. It is not necessary to bring out the large plastic tote, this is storage for extras. Feel free to open and see if anything else is needed.

The Nitty Gritty

Regular coffee is made in the large coffee pot, proportions are marked on the side of the box. Turn on Corey (takes 10 min. to warm up) warmers to brew decaf. Put a kettle of water on the stove for tea.

Set up plates, cups, napkins, snacks and other accouterments. (Prepare a platter for Martin, the maintenance man who does a lot for us.) Set aside and/or let him know when ready.)

The president will announce break time, be prepared to assist members with snacks and beverages.

When everyone is finished, leave kitchen as found. Clean out large coffee pot, turn off Corey, rinse pots, turn off stove, pack up club items and return them to storage. Nothing can be left behind including garbage. Take whatever containers you brought and enjoy the next 11 meetings!

Please let the Hostess Chairs know if any supplies are low. Also let them know who is kind enough to remove the trash from the premises. And don't hesitate to call on us for assistance!

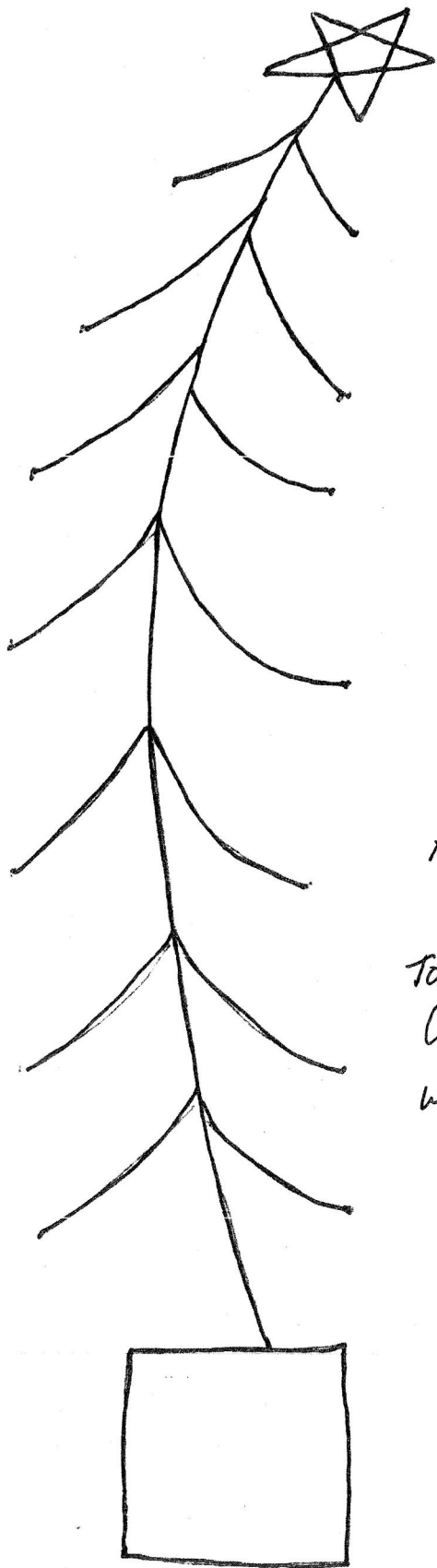
